Application Terms and Conditions

Eligibility:

The Australian Sedimentology Group Research Grants are open to Undergraduate, Honours, Masters and PhD Students and Early Career Researchers undertaking a sedimentology-focused research project. For the purpose of this award Early Career Researchers are defined as eight years post-PhD, excluding career breaks or interruptions.

Preference given to Australian citizens or residents, or applicants conducting research in Australia. Preference will be given to those without major sources of funding, although those with other funding sources are still encouraged to apply. Applicants must be GSA members, and are encouraged to join the Australian Sedimentologists Special Interest Group.

Applicants must complete the application form, then send this, along with a CV and academic transcript as email attachments to one single email message to australian.sedimentologists@gmail.com by 5pm AEST 23 April 2021.

Timeline and Review:

Applications close 5pm AEST 23 April 2021. No late applications will be accepted.

Applications will be ranked by a panel, which consists of a minimum of three qualified sedimentologists, including an early career or student sedimentologist. In the event of a conflict of interest (e.g. supervisor, collaborator, competitive/conflicting research interests), a reviewer will decline to review. Applications will be treated as confidential and will not be shared outside the committee. The decision of the committee is final. No correspondence will be entered into. By sending an application, you agree to our terms and conditions.

Successful grant recipients will be notified four weeks after applications close. If you've applied before, you're welcome to re-apply in subsequent rounds, no matter the outcome.

If a project is postponed or cancelled the ASG will work with the awardee to enable funding to be spent over a longer timeframe in order to achieve similar outcomes. Additionally, grants may be awarded to support students and/or projects particularly adversely effected by COVID-19.

Commitment:

Grants may be used as financial assistance for: field work costs, laboratory associated costs, research-related travel including conferences and professional development, or any other reasonable research-related cost as proposed by the applicant. The Committee may request applicants to provide further details of intended use of funds as listed on their application. The Committee may contact the advisor or referee as provided by the applicant.

Recipients are required to share research outcomes or experiences through a short report for TAG, GSA's national magazine, and one item of digital content such as but not limited to photographs, infographics, vlogs, a podcast episode, a recorded lecture etc. as the recipient would prefer and is comfortable contributing. This digital content will be featured on GSA's social media. Additional digital content can also be featured if the grant recipient desires. Recipients have one year from the receipt of grant to submit a report and digital content.
